

Education Benefits Module - Post-Module Assessment

Below is a prototype for an online assessment that Learners must complete in order to receive credit for attending the Education Benefits module. Learners must complete this assessment on their own within a short window of time after attending the module. While their final score on the assessment does not have any formal weight as a grade, the assessment has three primary goals:

1. Function as an assessment or achievement test of Learner knowledge after attending the module
2. Provide immediate feedback to Learners regarding their answers to the assessment and their knowledge of the material
3. Capture useful evaluative data about the module's efficacy

This assessment must be completed within 2 weeks of attending the Education Benefits Module. If it is not completed within that time frame, you will not receive credit for attending the Education Benefits Module and may need to attend the module again.

Do not rely on the advice of private lawyers for Benefits information. Private lawyers are not an authoritative source of information. The VA and DoD do not provide Benefits training to private lawyers. While some lawyers may provide good advice, it is very difficult to know which lawyers have good advice to offer. There have been many cases of lawyers giving incorrect Benefits information to Veterans (either accidentally or intentionally as part of a scam). It is much safer to rely on authoritative sources of Benefits information.
